Dear colleagues,

We are very pleased to invite you to the symposium ONE DAY ON OCCASIONAL LIVER RESECTIONS, to be held at the Academic Medical Center in Amsterdam, on Friday, March 30, 2012.

The “One day.....” symposia on liver surgery have become a tradition in Amsterdam. This year we address the less common indications for liver resection.

Liver resection for metastases of breast cancer is controversial, while liver resection for metastases of neuroendocrine tumors is standard treatment. More and more elderly patients are now referred for liver resection; how to deal with increased risk and where are the limits? The ultimate treatment in complex bile duct injuries is resection of the injured biliary segmental ducts along with liver resection; when to determine this radical solution? Although less common in the Western world, intrahepatic stone disease can be troublesome and may present with recurrent cholangitis. The problem is usually resolved by resection of the affected part of the liver. Management of liver cysts can be confusing, especially in the context of polycystic liver disease. Both non-surgical and surgical methods are used. Fibro-lamellar carcinoma is often seen in the absence of pre-existing liver disease and cirrhosis. Liver resection is the preferred treatment. Differentiation of liver adenoma and focal nodular hyperplasia (FNH) may be difficult but is important in the light of the need for resection. These benign lesions usually can be removed by enucleation. Liver resection for metastases of gynecological cancer is increasingly requested. Which patients do benefit from resection? Several technical issues of liver resection are also discussed or addressed in video presentations.

As last year, our symposium is presented under the auspices of the Dutch Study Group for Liver Surgery. We would like to thank our colleagues from world leading centers in liver surgery, for coming to Amsterdam to share their experience with us in this “ten year anniversary” of our “One day on.....” liver symposia.

We look forward to welcoming you at the AMC in Amsterdam on March 2012,
